SUBJECT: Atomic Safety Licensing Board (ASLB) Licensing
Requirements for the Susquehanna Nuclear Facility

SUBJECT: ASLB Licensing Requirements for the Susquehanna Nuclear Facility

Two offsite planning deficiencies were identified by the Susquehanna ASLB as requiring remedy before an operating license could be granted. Those deficiencies are: completion of written school plans; and completion of detailed transportation plans at the county and municipal levels to ensure the availability and allocation of buses and ambulances for evacuation of schools, persons who lack their own means of transportation, and evacuation of hospitals and nursing homes.

On May 10, the FEMA Region III office received written school plans from FEMA covering the six school districts falling within the Susquehanna EPL. Those school plans are:

Greater Nanticoke Area - Luzerne County
Northwest Area - Luzerne County
Lewistown Area - Luzerne County
Servick Area - Luzerne/Columbia - Note: Although located in Columbia County, this school district contains students from both counties.

Bloomsburg Area - Columbia County
Central Columbia - Columbia County

All six plans are found to be adequate, with minor comments. In fact, each school plan included comments from FEMA which addressed all the minor comments identified by FEMA. Insofar as each school district received FEMA's comments, and FEMA Region III concurs with them, no further discussion is necessary.

On June 8, FEMA Region III received from FEMA written transportation plans for the 19 risk municipalities in Luzerne County and the 8 risk municipalities in Columbia County. In addition, the transportation annexes of the Luzerne and Columbia Counties plans have been updated to accurately reflect the availability and commitment of bus and ambulance resources. All 27 municipal plans, and both County transportation annexes are found to be adequate in terms of bus and ambulance resources and their allocation.
