AGENCY: Nuclear Regulatory Commission.

ACTION: Finding that the acceptance criteria in the combined license are met. *[If interim operation allowed, add: Order allowing interim operation.]*

SUMMARY: The U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) found pursuant to Title 10 of the *Code of Federal Regulations* (10 CFR) 52.103(g) that the acceptance criteria in the combined license for [plant name] are met. *[If interim operation allowed, add: The NRC also issued an order allowing interim operation pending the completion of a hearing associated with closure of inspections, tests, analyses, and acceptance criteria (ITAAC). This order was based on a Commission determination that there was reasonable assurance of adequate protection of the public health and safety during a period of interim operation.]* Because of [this action/these actions], [interim] operation of the facility is allowed.

SUPPLEMENTARY INFORMATION: Under 10 CFR 2.106, “Notice of issuance,” the NRC is providing notice that it has found that the acceptance criteria in the combined license for [plant name] are met. Section 185b. (42 U.S.C. 2235(b)) of the Atomic Energy Act of 1954, as amended (AEA), and 10 CFR 52.97(b) require that the Commission identify within the combined license the inspections, tests, and analyses, including those applicable to emergency planning, that the licensee shall perform, and the acceptance criteria that, if met, are necessary and sufficient to provide reasonable assurance that the facility has been constructed and will be operated in conformity with the license, the provisions of the AEA, and the Commission’s rules and regulations. In compliance with these requirements, the Commission included ITAAC in Appendix C to the combined license [license #] for [plant name].

AEA Section 185b. also requires, in part, that following issuance of the combined license, the Commission shall ensure that the prescribed inspections, tests, and analyses are performed, and before operation of the facility, find that the prescribed acceptance criteria are met. The NRC codified the requirement to ensure completion of the inspections, tests, and analyses in 10 CFR 52.99(e) and codified the requirement regarding the finding that the acceptance criteria are met in 10 CFR 52.103(g).

The NRC staff has determined that the inspections, tests, and analyses have been successfully completed and found that all specified acceptance criteria in the [plant name] combined license [license #] are met. This finding (ADAMS Accession No. [XXXXXXXX]) was made on [date] and was effective on [date]. The principal basis for the staff’s 10 CFR 52.103(g) finding was the staff’s review of the licensee’s ITAAC notifications under 10 CFR 52.99(c) and the staff’s inspection of ITAAC-related activities conducted by the licensee. The staff explained the basis for its finding in the document titled “10 CFR 52.103(g) Basis Document [plant name]” (ADAMS Accession No. [XXXXXXXX]).

[If interim operation allowed, add: Section 189a.(1)(B) (42 U.S.C. 2239(a)(1)(B)) of the AEA provides an opportunity to request a hearing on conformance with the acceptance criteria. A hearing request in the ITAAC proceeding for [plant name] was granted. In this circumstance, Section 189a.(1)(B) of the AEA provides that the Commission shall allow interim operation pending completion of the hearing if it determines that there is reasonable assurance of adequate protection of the public health and safety during a period of interim operation. In an order dated [date] (ADAMS Accession No. [XXXXXXX]), the Commission determined that there is such reasonable assurance of adequate protection during a period of interim operation. The staff issued an order allowing interim operation on [date], which was effective on [date] (ADAMS Accession No. [XXXXXXX]). Interim operation will be allowed until subsequent NRC action is taken based on the outcome of the hearing.] Because of [this action/these actions], [interim] operation of the facility is allowed.
