Michael V. Stimac, being first duly sworn, on oath deposes and says:

1. I am Manager, Licensing and Regulation, of Puget Sound Power & Light Company. My responsibilities include the licensing of the proposed Skagit/Hanford Nuclear Project. I have personal knowledge of the matters referred to in this affidavit. I am submitting this affidavit in support of Applicants' Answer to Yakima Indian Nation Motion for Reconsideration of Memorandum and Order of October 29, 1982 and in response to the accompanying Affidavit of Russell Jim dated December 10, 1982.

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2. Reference is made to page 3 of the Russell Jim affidavit wherein the following statements are made:

The plans of the applicant show that they intend to fence and exclude all persons from the site area. . . . Applicant's plans show that the site area will be fenced and members of YIN excluded.

Further, your affiant knows that along the stretch of river that the fencing exclusion from both project site and the Hanford Reservation will exclude the Yakima Indians from their usual and accustomed fishing sites along that stretch of the Columbia River which have been exercised by the Yakima Indians.


3. The land on which the S/HNP facilities will be located consists of (1) the "Site" and (2) the "Associated Areas". The Site (the plant site proper) consists of a rectangular area of about 1200 acres. See the S/HNP ASC/ER, Section 2.1.1.1 and Figures 2.1-1b, 2.1-2, and 2.1-3. As can be seen from Figure 2.1-1b, the Site is set back about six miles from the Columbia River. The Applicants do intend to fence the Site.

4. The Associated Areas consist of easements for the following facilities:

1. intake and discharge pipelines and pumphouse
2. railroad
3. transmission lines
4. access roads


S/HNP ASC/ER, Section 2.1.1.2. The location of these easements is shown on Figure 2.1-1b and in more detail on Figure 2.1-3. As can be seen, the only one of these easements that approaches

the Columbia River is the pipeline and pumphouse easement, which extends to the river's edge. The pipelines will be buried underground. The only above-ground S/HNP facility in the vicinity of the Columbia River will be the pumphouse, which will be on the West side of the river set back approximately 200 feet from the riverbank at ordinary high water. ASC/ER, Section 4.1.2.2 (p. 4.1-15, first partial paragraph). The Applicants do not plan to erect any fence around the pumphouse or elsewhere along or in the vicinity of the Columbia River.

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
