Dear Dave: ...

On December 30, 1982, I received from you a copy of the Memorandum, dated December 28, 1982, from Richard H. Vollmer to Joseph Halapatz concerning the resolution of Mr. Halapatz' Differing Professional Opinion (DPO). The County's consultant, Dale Bridenbaugh, has also had an opportunity to review that document.

Unfortunately, the discussion in the Memorandum is extremely general; it contains no information whatsoever concerning the anticipated implementation of the Staff conclusions set forth therein. In addition, the County has not yet been furnished with the pertinent documents concerning the Monticello inspection program which is referenced throughout the Memorandum. As you know, the County's request for these documents has been outstanding for quite some time; moreover, on December 21, 1982, the Board ordered that the documents be furnished to the County by December 30, 1982. Needless to say, it is impossible to evaluate in any meaningful fashion the Staff discussion contained in the Vollmer Memorandum without having access to the pertinent Monticello information.

Furthermore, in addition to the County's need for the Monticello information, we have several questions, which are set forth below, concerning the substance of the Memorandum and the Staff's position on this matter with respect to Shoreham. The County must obtain answers to these questions before a determination can be made as to whether it will be necessary to litigate the issues raised by the DPO. Accordingly, please provide answers to the following questions as soon as possible:

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1. How does the Staff plan to implement the conclusions stated in the Vollmer Memorandum with respect to Shoreham? Specifically, what is the Staff going to require LILCO to do?

A. Please identify the specific portions of the Monticello inspection program that will be made applicable to Shoreham (of course, this assumes that copies of pertinent documents relating to that program are provided to the County).

B. Identify any portions of the Monticello program that will not be required at Shoreham.

C. Identify any additional Shoreham-specific requirements that will be imposed to replace and/or supplement aspects of the Monticello program.

D. With specific reference to the Attachment to the Vollmer Memorandum, what is the scope of the "accessible surfaces" referenced therein? Does it include all reactor internal components? If not, which components are excluded?

E. What is the frequency of inspection, that will be required at Shoreham, as referenced in the Memorandum and Attachment?

2. When will the Staff require LILCO to perform the actions identified in response to Question (1) above?

3. How does the Staff intend to enforce the Staff requirements identified in response to Questions (1) and (2)? Will the requirements be stated as a license condition?

4. Please describe the intended Staff review of whatever commitment and actions are to be required from LILCO.

A. Who will perform the review?

B. What will be its scope?

C. When will it be performed?

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
D. Will this matter be identified as an open item for which an SER supplement will be written?

E. How will the Staff review be documented?

Please let me know if you have any questions concerning the above requests. Mr. Bridenbaugh, as well as myself, will be available to discuss these matters with appropriate Staff personnel if such discussions would be useful in expediting the transmission of information to the County.

I look forward to hearing from you soon concerning this matter.

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
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
