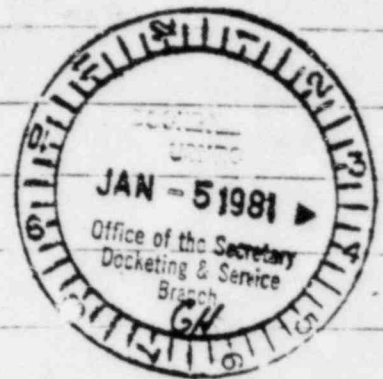

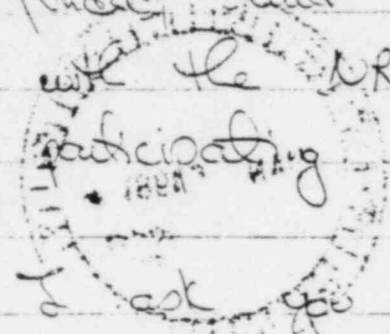
Dear Mr. Ahearn,
