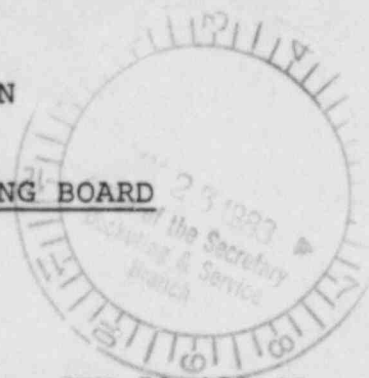

AFFIDAVIT OF MILTON A. STILLER
ON REED CONTENTION 5, PARTS B AND C
(RADIO COMMUNICATIONS)

MILTON A. STILLER, being duly sworn, deposes and says
as follows:

1. I am the Manager, Nuclear Safety and Emergency
Preparedness for Applicant, Union Electric Company.

In my professional capacity, I have been personally
involved in the development of the offsite (local and
state) and on-site plans and procedures for the Callaway
Plant for the past six years. During the course of my
work, I have had the opportunity to meet on numerous
occasions with the emergency management directors, the
sheriffs and other local government officials for the four
counties -- Callaway, Montgomery, Gasconade and Osage --
located in the Callaway plume exposure pathway emergency
planning zone ("EPZ"). Further, I have attended numerous
industrial symposiums, am active in related emergency
organizations and have participated in several emergency

exercises at operating nuclear plants. My business address is Union Electric Company, P.O. Box 149, St. Louis, Missouri 63121. I have personal knowledge of the matters stated herein and believe them to be true and correct. I make this affidavit in response to Reed Contention 5 (Radio Communications), Parts B and C.

2. The purpose of this affidavit is to identify the communications requirements and the resources which will be available to meet those requirements in response to Reed Contention 5, Parts B and C.

3. Reed Contention 5, Part B asserts that the absence of transceivers at vehicle impound lots will hamper effective operations. I agree with Mr. Reed in this assertion and hereby commit that at least one transceiver will be located at each vehicle impound lot. This transceiver will either be permanently equipped in a vehicle under the control of a person assigned to the impound lot or that person will be provided with a portable transceiver capable of maintaining contact with the County Emergency Operations Center. These transceivers will be made available by Union Electric, after the distribution of other available transceivers from alternate sources and will be sufficient in number to equip each of the impound lots. These impound lots have been identified as being seven (7) in number. Affidavit of Walter M. Clark on Reed Contention 1 (Staffing - Sheriff's


Office) at 6; Affidavit of Gerald W. Stanfill on Reed Contention 1 (Staffing Sheriff's Office) at 3-4.

4. I am satisfied that this commitment to ensure the presence of transceivers at all identified impound lots adequately provides for communication at those facilities.

5. Reed Contention 5, Part C asserts that because they lack transceivers, patrol or rescue vehicles entering the EPZ will not have the capability to communicate with backup support during an emergency. I agree with Mr. Reed's assertion and hereby commit that all such vehicles will either have permanently mounted communications equipment or will be provided with a portable system prior to their entrance into the Emergency Planning Zone. This commitment is specifically limited to patrol and rescue vehicles identified by those appropriate County or State authorities that exercise the authority to allow entrance into the Emergency Planning Zone. These transceivers will be made available by Union Electric, supplementing the use of all available transceivers from alternate sources, including those currently in use by such patrol and rescue vehicles.

6. I am satisfied that this commitment to supply the additional transceivers necessary for designated patrol and rescue vehicles adequately provides sufficient communication for their patrol and rescue functions.

7. Finally, in my view, this satisfies Mr. Reed's
Contention 5, Parts B and C.
