
Dear Mr. Denton:

Paragraph (g) of 10 CFR 50.49 requires that each holder of an operating license identify the electric equipment important to safety which is already qualified and to submit a schedule for either qualification or replacement of the remaining equipment which is covered by the scope of the rule. Please be advised that the information previously submitted to support licensing of McGuire Unit 2 applies equally to Unit 1, specifically in letters dated February 23, 1983 and May 12, 1983.

Additionally, by letter dated May 11, 1983 (and a clarification letter dated May 20, 1983) Duke Power Company provided its response to the Franklin Research Center Technical Evaluation Report. This letter provided qualification schedules and justification for interim operation for certain equipment.

Please advise if there are any questions regarding this matter.
