Dear Chairman Lawrence:

As residents of Long Island we are deeply concerned about the threats posed by the opening of the Shoreham nuclear plant in our neighboring county.

As you know Suffolk County in which the plant is housed has deemed it impossible to evacuate the Island in the event of an accident at the plant. Long Island is unique in that it is heavily populated and has few main roads in and out of the specific area in question. Normal traffic takes hours to move through the area in question during normal rush hours. In the event of an accident local residents would be trapped. No adequate plan for evacuation has been developed. It is questionable that there can be one.

LILCO has refused to allow for safety inspection of the plant by the County or by impartial experts. This makes us very fearful as the plant has been poorly planned and full of "bugs" since the earliest days of its construction.

The question of storage and removal of spent fuel is of great import. Thus far there has been no response to the danger this radioactive matter poses by LILCO.

The Shoreham Plant has become a source of fear, for those of us who live on Long Island. Fear for our health and safety, fear that LILCO is not telling us the truth about the human and economic costs that we will have to pay if the Shoreham plant goes on line.

We urge that you hold public limited appearance hearing on Long Island before any formal litigation begins here. You owe it to yourselves and to the citizens who live in the shadow of the plant to hear from us on our concerns re. Shoreham.
