

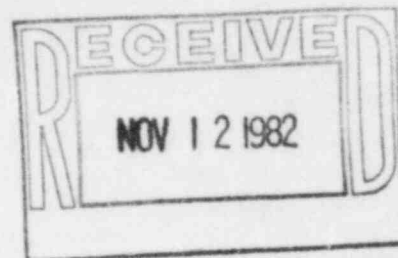

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### NOTICE OF DEVIATION

By letter dated October 7, 1982, (OCNA108206) to Mr. William Cavanaugh III you requested AP&L's response to a notice of deviation as a result of an inspection conducted by Messrs. W. D. Johnson and L. J. Callan covering the period of August 1-31, 1982. The notice of deviation is repeated below followed by our response.

#### Information Not Submitted to NRC Contractor as Committed

"Arkansas Power and Light Company, in a letter to the Commission, dated April 16, 1982, stated that the additional information relating to the environmental qualification of electrical equipment requested by letters from the Commission, dated January 20, 1982, and February 19, 1982, would be submitted to Franklin Research Center by March 15 and 31, respectively.

In deviation from the above, the requested additional information had not been submitted as of July 15, 1982.

This is a deviation from a written commitment to the Commission."

#### Response:

Due to the large number of information requests received during early 1982, AP&L required schedule extensions on several items including the two letters cited above dated January 20, 1982, (1CNA018206) and February 19, 1982, (1CNA028204). This was discussed in our letter dated April 16, 1982, (OCAN048207) which cited twenty-eight (28) requests which had been received within a three month period. Our April 16, 1982, letter gave revised schedules of May 15 and May 31 for these items versus the originally requested submittal dates of February 19 and March 21. Please note that your October 7, 1982, letter erroneously listed the revised submittal dates as March 15 and 31.

Subsequent to our April 16, 1982, letter additional delays were experienced on some of these items. This situation was discussed on several occasions via telephone conversations between AP&L Licensing personnel and the ANO-1 NRR Project Manager. The NRR Project Manager acknowledged the delay and did not indicate the delay to be unacceptable. Based on these conversations it was not felt an additional written request for schedule relief was required.

The requested information was submitted by letters dated July 29, 1982, (OCAN078220) and August 13, 1982, (OCAN088207) therefore full compliance has been achieved. In order to prevent recurrence AP&L has implemented a commitment tracking system. This system was described in AP&L's letter dated May 13, 1982, (OCAN058207) from Mr. J. R. Marshall to Mr. W. C. Seidle. This system will provide for better management control of commitment compliance. In addition, future verbal discussions of commitment schedules will be followed up in writing.
