
Several other areas of the draft plan need additional work, and they include but are not limited to the following:

11. Training

The Town of Newbury is certainly willing to work with your firm in preparing a plan that will provide the best possible protection for the residents of the community, and I welcome the opportunity to discuss with your firm the areas of the plan I feel need improvement.

As the Town of Newbury is mandated to have any Emergency Response Plans approved at a Town Meeting, it is important that work on the Re-Draft begin as soon as possible.
