On April 14, 1983 Boston Edison Company executives met with members of your staff, to present its Long Term Program and schedule. During that meeting Boston Edison presented the Program's objectives and the methodology for the Programs development and implementation. At the close of that meeting Boston Edison stated its intention to formally submit its Long Term Program on the Pilgrim Docket.
