Administrative Letter (AL) 94-11 requested comments on the Pilot Program for NRC Recognition of Good Performance by Nuclear Power Plants. The purpose of this letter is to provide Illinois Power's (IP's) response to the AL.

The AL posed eleven specific questions regarding the Good Performer Program. Some of the questions are best answered only by the plants that have been mentioned on the list in the past. Since Clinton Power Station (CPS) has not yet achieved the Systematic Assessment of Licensee Performance (SALP) ratings required to be mentioned on the good performer list, IP is volunteering only some general remarks about the program.


IP management has established targets and defined measurements for plant performance. IP views the good performer list, as well as the associated SALP ratings, as one of several indications that efforts to improve performance and achieve goals are successful. The CPS management team envisions many benefits as a result of being mentioned on the good performer list. Among them, and possibly the most important, is the satisfaction that will be felt by the entire staff upon realizing that efforts to achieve the highest standard of performance have been successful.
