



Emergency Planning - Revised Response

Gentlemen:

The following is provided as a clarification to our response to Item 3 contained in our letter dated March 15, 1983, (ØCANØ38313).

Our response stated that it is mandatory the Early Warning System (EWS) be activated upon initiation of a Site or General Emergency. This is a correct statement in accordance with the Arkansas Nuclear One Emergency Plan. However, the State of Arkansas has actual control over the activation of the EWS. The State of Arkansas Plan was recently revised in this area to be more consistent with NUREG-0654. That Plan now requires mandatory EWS notification upon initiation of a General Emergency.

The next revision to the ANO Emergency Plan will provide this change to make the two documents consistent.

We apologize if our initial response was confusing and trust this information will clarify the issue.
