Dear Senator D'Amato:

I read that radioactive waste
was dumped into Lake Erie
from the Fermi Nuclear Plant
in Monroe, Michigan. Erie County
and New York State were not informed
beforehand.

The Nuclear Regulatory Commission
does not address the accumulation
from two dozen nuclear plants that
regularly release long-lived
isotopes into the Great Lakes.

The International Commission on
Radiological Protection found
that "risks associated with
ionizing radiation are about
three times higher than they were
estimated to be decade ago."
This is our drinking water, and it
should be protected.
