VIOLATION 50-416/83-14-03

I. ADMISSION OR DENIAL OF THE ALLEGED VIOLATION

Mississippi Power & Light admits to the alleged violation as written. There was no affect on the health and safety of the public.

II. REASON FOR THE VIOLATION IF ADMITTED

The technician performing the calibration failed to follow the procedure.

III. CORRECTIVE STEPS WHICH HAVE BEEN TAKEN AND THE RESULTS ACHIEVED

The technician who caused the violation was suspended for seven days.

IV. CORRECTIVE STEPS WHICH WILL BE TAKEN TO AVOID FURTHER VIOLATIONS

The action listed above is felt to be adequate. Procedure adherence is still receiving significant emphasis.

V. DATE WHEN FULL COMPLIANCE WILL BE ACHIEVED

Full compliance is in effect.
