The existence of the Hartment allegations were known as you state on Page 2. The transcript was not available in the PDR to the best of my knowledge. I have just read the Hartment allegations . They are much much brader than just fudging leak rates. They have not been aired.

You were grossly remiss in your duty to protect the health and safety of the public by not fully airing the Hartment matter in the Restart Hearings as his ~~that~~ allegations did affect the safety of the public.
