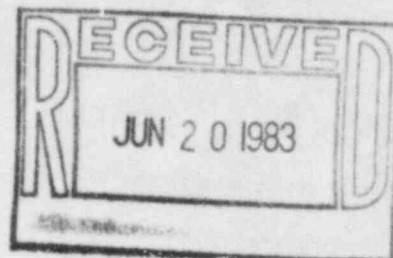

Control Program Status Report

Gentlemen:

This is our fifth monthly report on the progress of the Regulatory Response and Commitment Control Program. Following is a discussion of progress on each major area of the program on which we are required to report status.

1. Verification of implementation of commitments made since January 1, 1979.

We stated in our status report to you dated May 13, 1983, (ØCANØ5831Ø) that fifteen (15) items (other than for fire protection) remained open. Of those, one has been added to the fire protection related open items and seven (7) have been completed. As of this reporting date seven (7) remain open. Six (6) of these remaining items are associated with AP&L's response to IE Bulletins 79-02 and 79-14, addressing concrete expansion anchors and safety-related piping supports. Although all work required in response to these bulletins is felt to be complete, the extremely large volume of documentation generated as a result of these bulletins has resulted in difficulty in verification of some items. Therefore, AP&L has initiated an engineering review of work associated with these items. A schedule for completion of this review will be provided with our next status report.

The one additional remaining open item is scheduled for completion by June 17, 1983.

The fourteen (14) fire protection open items are being addressed concurrently with Appendix R issues. Our schedule for completion remains August 31, 1983.

2. Procedure revision and commitment tracking.

The Licensing procedures have been revised and issued, and appropriate training has been conducted. This item is now closed.


The passive commitment tracking issue is still being reviewed, and a needs assessment report is being developed. The report is scheduled for issuance August 1, 1983.

3. Priority scheme for nuclear regulatory issues.

The status of this item remains as stated in our previous report. The priority scheme will be tested on a few long term items in support of our capital planning case, and the results will be evaluated and appropriate modifications made. A Licensing Section guideline will be developed to implement the use of the priority scheme in the Licensing Section.

Our next status report will be approximately July 14, 1983.
