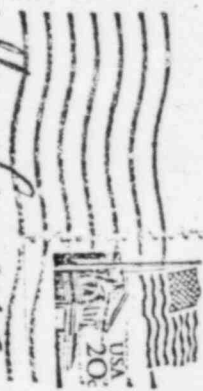


Dear Congressman:
