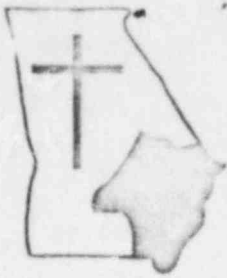

Dear Senator Mattingly,

In the Savannah Morning News on July 15, 1983 there were several articles regarding Nuclear Plants and the problems involved.

In one of the articles Plant Hatch at Baxley was identified as one of eleven with reactors where cracks were found during inspection.

How do I know that the NRC is telling the truth? How do you know that the situation at the plant at Baxley is not far worse than identified by the NRC.

My Mother and Brother live five miles from the plant. If reports on television and in the newspapers have any validity at all the Regulatory Commission of the Reagan administration are interested primarily in profits and not in people.

I will be interested to hear what you are doing to assure the security of your constituents who live in the area of the nuclear plant at Baxley.
