REPORT OF PARTIES REGARDING ORDER
OF PRESENTATION OF WITNESSES

In its Memorandum and Order Confirming Prehearing Conference Rulings on Status of Certain Parties and Schedule Regarding Certain Contentions (October 20, 1983), the Atomic Safety and Licensing Board ("Board") requested to be informed by December 1, 1983 as to the order of consideration of the contentions if an order other than suggested by the Licensing Board, i.e., Contentions V-3a and V-3b, together as a pair, and then V-4 (Tr. 4920) was agreed upon.^{1/} As already reported to the Board by Applicant,^{2/} the involved parties are unable to agree on a different order of presentation. 3. Panel of Harry E. P. Krug, Earl Markee and Bernard Geier


^{3/} Mr. Anthony states that he might request that these two contentions be considered separately.
