Gentlemen:

Please be advised that LILCO does not plan to provide formal written responses to the subject Generic Letters (references 1 & 2) as these (1) are addressed to "Holders of Operating Licenses" and (2) do not require action to maintain safe storage and handling of irradiated fuel. Additionally, LILCO plans to provide formal written responses only to NRC correspondence which is: (1) directly addressed to LILCO, or (2) addressed to holders of possession only licenses, or (3) addressed to all NRC Licensees and requires action to maintain safe storage and handling of irradiated fuel.

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Background

On June 14, 1991, the NRC Staff issued amendment number 7 to NPF 12 which transformed the Shoreham operating license to a possession only license (see reference 3). On July 20, 1991, this amendment became effective. Therefore, LILCO is no longer: (1) a holder of an operating license, nor (2) obligated to provide formal written responses to NRC generic correspondence (i.e., Generic Letters, Bulletins and Information Notices) addressed to "Holders of Operating Licenses". It is against this background that LILCO has established its plan for responding to NRC generic correspondence. LILCO will continue to review NRC generic correspondence to determine its applicability to Shoreham in the DEFUELED MODE and will take actions necessary to maintain safe storage and handling of irradiated fuel.

In a related matter LILCO informed the NRC (see reference 4) of its intention to indefinitely defer certain regulatory activities identified in the letter. LILCO now informs the NRC Staff that these deferred activities are cancelled and that LILCO will no longer administratively track these deferred activities.
