15-4 HOW MANY QUALIFIED ADULT BACKUP DRIVERS HAVE BEEN SELECTED FOR SCHOOL BUSES? WHAT CAPACITY WILL THE BUSES THEY DRIVE HAVE? HOW MANY CHILDREN ARE IN SCHOOL IN THE EPZ DURING A NORMAL SCHOOL DAY?

Answer: Any emergency worker of city and county government can be used as bus drivers in an emergency. Based on the definition of emergency worker, the number of drivers could range from 200 to over 1,000. The normal capacity of school bus is about 55-60. If everyone is in attendance, the school population (students) is 2,818.




