APPLICANTS' SUPPLEMENTAL RESPONSES TO  
WELLS EDDLEMAN'S GENERAL INTERROGATORIES AND INTERROGATORIES  
ON CONTENTIONS 9, 11, 41, 45, 116 AND 132C(II) TO  
APPLICANTS CAROLINA POWER & LIGHT COMPANY,  
ET AL. (EIGHTH SET)

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Applicants Carolina Power & Light Company and North Carolina Eastern Municipal Power Agency hereby submit the following response to Eddleman Interrogatory 41-20(188) which Applicants were unable to provide with their initial response to Mr. Eddleman's Eighth Set of Interrogatories filed on April 17, 1984.

INTERROGATORY NO. 41-20(188). Has any (i) welder (ii) welding inspection (iii) other person, ever been (aa) disciplined (bb) laid off (cc) sent for retraining (dd) required to be retrained or to take further training, because of (A) making (B) approving, defective (iv) welds (v) pipe hangers, at Harris? If so, please identify each such person.

ANSWER: A review of personnel, Daniel training, and weld engineering records on the welders identified in Exhibit B to

Applicants' March 14, 1984 response to Interrogatories 41-1(1) and (m) indicates that none of these welders were disciplined (a punitive action involving suspension without pay or termination), laid off, sent for retraining or required to be retrained or take further training because of making defective welds on pipe hangers at the Harris Plant. Further, none of the weld inspectors identified in Exhibit 1 to Applicants' May 12, 1983 response to Interrogatory 41-1(a) and 41-24 were disciplined or laid off because of approving defective welds on pipe hangers at the Harris Plant. Continuing on-going training is provided to weld inspectors. See Applicants' answer to Interrogatory 41-32.

OBJECTION: Applicants object to this interrogatory to the extent that it seeks information on "other persons" and non-pipe hanger welding as burdensome, irrelevant and outside

the scope of the contention. As to the remaining Craft 66 employees identified in Exhibit A to Applicants March 14, 1984 responses, see objection to Interrogatory No. 41-X-1(b).
