Management Actions Taken

Drug and alcohol testing results for the reporting period are described in Attachment 1.

All contractor employees testing positive for drugs/alcohol were denied access to the Protected Area. In accordance with plant administrative procedure requirements, individuals and/or their company representative were informed of the right to appeal, and of the procedural requirements in order to re-establish unescorted access to the Protected Area. To date, none of these individuals have initiated steps to appeal or re-establish unescorted access.

Three individuals were subjected to unannounced follow-up testing (fourteen total tests) during the reporting period, as a result of Fitness-For-Duty concerns.
