Dear Commissioner Gilinsky:


On February 1, 1984 the York Daily Record printed a story about Phila. Electric's plan to construct a radioactive storage site for low-level waste for \$30 million at Peach Bottom, PA. Up to this point, we (local citizens) knew nothing about this renewed purposal. Last year it was discussed and then it was announced that the purposal was discarded.

Today (Feb.9) we attended the regularly scheduled York County Commissioners public meeting. We protested this highhanded method of informing residents about this purposal after the fact. We were informed by our Commissioners that the project is already under construction...that the NRC has already concurred with this purposal...that it is out of the hands of the Commissioners...that they knew little or nothing about the purposal...that if there was a required escrow account, they knew nothing about it and they are not aware of any accountability regarding future off-site leakage or should the company file bankruptcy.

A public hearing has been scheduled for Feb. 17, 84, for public comment. Why has this purposal been drawn and approved, if, indeed, such is the case, without notifying local residents before a hearing?

I will spare you any additional details simply by requesting a copy of the Phila. Electric's purposal for a waste storage dump at Peach Bottom, PA.
