Wells Eddleman's Motion for Extension of Time
to ask Questions based on information
from Welders Identified in March 1984

According to Applicants' counsel Baxter's most recent letters, Applicants are unwilling to allow more time to formulate interrogatories on Eddleman 41 re information from welders. Therefore I am separately filing interrogatories concerning the welder information delivered (after a very lengthy discovery dispute).

But I also move the Board to allow additional time after the welders have been contacted, to formulate and file interrogatories based on information from the welders. Due to illness and overwork in this case and other matters, I have not as a practical matter even been able to get people under appropriate in camera commitments so they can help me ~~x~~ contact welders, and I have not been able to do the contacting myself of the numerous welders on this list. Obviously, I should not be expected to file interrogatories until I have received the info needed to file them. I would propose an extension until July 30, 1984, taking into account the June environmental hearing and the need to make proposed findings from it. I realize this motion may be considered premature but am filing it with allowed time for discovery so as not to waive any rights to discovery.
