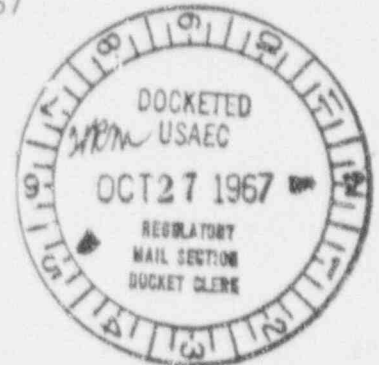

Dear Dr. Morris:

The following is submitted in order to complete the referenced application, with a view that we may be licensed to possess physically, but not operate, the subject research reactor, under lease from the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, and that the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, acting through the Department of Forests and Waters, be licensed as possessor of legal title to the reactor:

1) We wish to incorporate by reference the procedures and other relevant descriptive information contained in the applications to the existing license as they now apply, including but not limited to the Curtiss Wright Corporation Hazards Evaluation Report of April 1959, as amended and supplemented to the extent applicable to our possession of the reactor in a shut-down condition.

2) As indicated in our letter of October 4, 1967 the fuel elements which had at one time been in the pool, comprising the core identified in item b) 1) of the letter of September 29, 1960 from The Pennsylvania State University to the Commission, have been removed. They have been returned to the Commission (Savannah River). The remaining fuel elements at the site, identified in item b) 2) of that letter (containing a maximum of 5.3 kilograms of uranium 235) are stored in the fuel storage vault at the facility. We assume that the license will cover this fuel as well as the related materials heretofore covered by the license, such as a plutonium-beryllium source and fission chambers.

3) We have obtained financial protection from Nuclear Energy Liability Insurance Association and we have requested NELIA to forward evidence of this to the Commission. We accordingly request indemnification pursuant to section 170 of the Atomic Energy Act of 1954, as amended, covering our possession of the reactor in shut-down condition.

4) We request that the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, acting through its Department of Forests and Waters, be recognized and licensed as possessor of title to the facility at the same time as we are licensed to possess it physically, but not to operate it. The Commonwealth of Pennsylvania joins in this request, as evidenced by the countersignatures on its behalf below.

5) We request that, upon transfer of the license to us, The Pennsylvania State University be appropriately notified and relieved from any further responsibility thereunder.

Thank you kindly for your assistance in this matter.

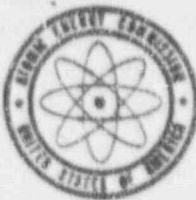

Gentlemen:

Your letter dated September 6, 1967, informed the Commission that title to The Curtiss-Wright Nuclear Research Laboratory is being transferred to the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. Subsequently, the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, acting through its Department of Forests and Waters, and the Nuclear Materials and Equipment Corporation filed a joint application to take title to and to possess, but not to operate, the facility, respectively.

The Commission has found that the transfer is in accordance with the provisions of the Atomic Energy Act of 1954, as amended, and has given its consent pursuant to the provisions of Section 50.80 of 10 CFR Part 50. Accordingly, Amendment No. 3 to Facility License No. R-72, copy enclosed, has been issued authorizing the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania through its Department of Forests and Waters to possess title to the facility, and NUMEC to possess, but not to operate the facility.

With the issuance of this amendment, The Pennsylvania State University's authority as a licensee under this license is terminated. The Order terminating The Pennsylvania State University interest in License No. R-72 is enclosed.

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
