SUBJECT: Follow up to CO2 Information Memo MP-SEC-89-89

In the above referenced memo dated July 14, 1989 I indicated that telephones would be installed in the area of the Unit 3 cable tunnels ( Security Doors 303 and 304 ). Further assessment of the benefit of installing telephone communication in this area was conducted by Station Services Engineering and Maintenance. Because the area in question must have the CO2 system locked out prior to entry, it was determined that the benefit of installing phones would be minimal. Security does not respond to these areas without the CO2 System being locked. The officers are dispatched and monitored by the Central Alarm Station. In the event the Officer does not respond in a timely manner or does not punch the card reader, additional personnel are dispatched to ascertain the officer's well being. This coupled with the CCTV located in the area provides a high degree of safety for the Security Officers involved.

While a plan to enhance telephone communication on Unit 3 in general is still an open issue there is currently no plan for additional telephones to be installed in this area for safety reasons.
