Diablo Canyon Units 1 and 2
Request for Exemption to 10 CFR 73

Gentlemen:

PG&E letter DCL 95-092, dated May 5, 1995, requested an exemption to 10 CFR 73.55(d)(5) and provided a draft of proposed changes to the Diablo Canyon Power Plant's Physical Security Plan (PSP). PG&E letter DCL 95-161, dated July 28, 1995, contained a revision to the draft submitted in May.

Enclosure 1 to this letter proposes a revision to clarify issues, which were identified on September 6 and 7, 1995, during telephone conversations with the NRC staff. Enclosure 1 includes a description of the changes made as a result of the telephone conversation.

Enclosure 2 to this letter are the changes made to the proposed draft submitted PG&E's letter DCL 95-161, July 28, 1995.

Enclosure 3 is the draft of the proposed changes to the PSP incorporating the changes identified in Enclosure 1 and 2. Changes are indicated by side bars in the left margin. Additions are indicated by bold type and deletions are indicated by strike through markings.

Enclosure 4 is a sketch of the proposed Security Building layout, once hand geometry is in place. It is not to scale.

Subsequent to approval of the requested exemption described in the Enclosure 2, PG&E will submit a formal request for changes to the PSP in accordance with 10 CFR 50.54(p).


