Dear Mr. Stolz:

This letter requests an extension in the schedule requested in your letter of September 14, 1984 (J. F. Stolz, NRC, to E. G. Bauer, Jr., PECO) for additional information regarding the location of the Technical Support Center for the Peach Bottom Atomic Power Station. Your letter was received on September 19, 1984, and requested a response within 30 days of that date. A request for an additional 30 days to provide a response was discussed by telephone with the NRC Project Manager on October 10, 1984, and we were informed that this request was acceptable.

The information requested involves many aspects of the interface of the Technical Support Center with the Units 2 and 3 Control Room, requiring review by the many Company organizations responsible for the Peach Bottom Emergency Plan; e.g., Security, Engineering and Research Department, Plant Staff, Emergency Preparedness Section. The request arrived at the height of our preparations for the Peach Bottom emergency plan exercise held on October 17, 1984, and the final licensing activities associated with the Limerick Generating Station low power license. Most of the effort associated with these activities are expected to be completed shortly, releasing the necessary manpower resources to develop a response to the September 14, 1984, letter.

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Consequently, we propose to provide the information requested by November 19, 1984. Should you have any questions regarding this matter, please do not hesitate to contact us.
