
RE: San Onofre Nuclear Generating Station

Earlier in the year we received correspondences from the Nuclear Regulatory Commission regarding the "Gross Negligence" of Southern California Edison and the lack of an escape plan and routes away from the San Onofre Nuclear Generating Station for the citizens and residents of San Clemente.

The Nuclear Regulatory Commission mentioned that the final report would be ready in July of 1995 and as of yet I have not received any information as to the findings of the investigation into this despicable situation. Have you received any further correspondence from the Nuclear Regulatory Commission or a copy of the report from the N.R.C. about 10 CFR 2.206?
