PLANT. THESE CONCERNS WERE FIRST  
BROUGHT TO THE ATTENTION OF THE NRC,  
MARCH 9<sup>TH</sup>, 1983 AND WERE FURTHER  
LOOKED INTO AT A MEETING AT THEIR  
REGION I HEADQUARTERS IN KING OF  
PRUSSIA, PENNSYLVANIA ON JULY 13<sup>TH</sup>, 1983.  
THE LIST CONTAINS APPROXIMATELY FORTY  
ITEMS OF CONCERN OF WHICH ONLY SIX  
HAVE BEEN RESPONDED TO AS OF THIS DATE.

COMMENTS: Mr. Huber called the Congressman to request assistance in  
finding out answers to safety questions that he asked the Nuclear  
Regulatory Commission. Mr. Huber asked the questions at a hearing  
held on July 13, 1983 at King of Prussia, Pennsylvania. He was  
a sub-contractor on the Shoreham Nuclear Power Plant and found over  
40 safety violations that he brought to the NRC's attention. The  
NRC has as of today only answered 4 of the safety violations  
that Mr. Huber brought to there attention. He would like answers to  
the other 36. Privacy Act Letter to follow to Washington.
