As a rate-paying citizen of Rockford, I am concerned that the Byron Nuclear Plant will go on line before it has been proven, within human limits, to be safe.

To say the least I am puzzled, and disappointed by the performance of the NRC staff. It appears they wish to avoid looking bad for failures in compliance along the way, by supporting the Com-Ed case now, even in the face of serious allegations about plant safety still surfacing.

Every day that goes by, as testimony goes on I become more and more convinced that Byron is just not well or safely built. If it were so it would have been established by now.

I believe the testimony of plant workmen willing to face Com-Ed harassment, should be heard as part of these current hearings, especially if the adequacy of the NRC
