Dear Mr. Mendoca;

In review of our technical specifications for the AGN-201M reactor located at the University of New Mexico - Docket 50-252, we note that we are not in compliance with Section 6.9.1 - Annual Operating Report. A review of our records indicates that the annual report which should have been sent to you not later than September 30, 1995 was not submitted. To remedy this situation, I have enclosed a copy of the 1995 annual report for our facility. The major reason for the oversight on this issue was the effective shutdown of our facility waiting on approval of amendments to the technical specifications. Due to equipment failure in November of 1994, we required new equipment and amendment to the technical specifications to resume operation. The approval of the revised technical specifications was received in mid-November 1995 and since that time we have been working on installation and verification of the new equipment. In the process of operator requalification it was noted that we had not submitted the annual report. We believe that achieving operational status and resuming normal operations will provide us with the necessary checks on compliance with all of the technical specifications so that the oversight with the annual report will not occur again.
