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1 Q. So if Mr. Mosbaugh raised a totally ridiculous  
2 allegation to you, wouldn't that give you pause to think that  
3 Mr. Mosbaugh was acting ridiculous?

4 A. If Mr. Mosbaugh had raised it at the time that the  
5 valve was manipulated I would have given him serious  
6 consideration, because I at that point thought Mr. Mosbaugh  
7 was very honest.

8 Months after the event had been thoroughly  
9 investigated, you know, it gives a different feeling, a  
10 different opinion in my mind.

11 Q. And that was anger?

12 A. No. Totally ridiculous is -- it seems outlandish.

13 Q. If you learned that Allen Mosbaugh was the  
14 originator of that investigation, that would make you angry,  
15 wouldn't it?

16 A. No, it wouldn't.

17 Q. That would give you some form of emotion, wouldn't  
18 it?

19 Maybe you can help me. I'm trying to understand  
20 your --

21 A. I'm not sure I understand your question, sir. I  
22 mean my emotions change routinely.

23 Q. Now, it's fair to say that prior to filling out Mr.  
24 Mosbaugh's annual review that you knew the OI investigation  
25 into the dilution valves had taken place; is that correct?
