Dear Helen Hoyt:

I came To the public hearing at The Limerick Generating Station's information center on 11/15<sup>th</sup>, 1984 but didn't have a chance To speak. I hope I have That opportunity 12/13<sup>th</sup>, 1984 at The stove fire hall. After my wife, Ann McKee & her friend, Becky Rutherford registered to testify on 11/16<sup>th</sup> at The same place, (Limerick); a man came up and said something To your law clerk who Then let That man go ahead of my wife & her friend each with <sup>unborn</sup> year-old infants. That man, who was given <sup>unborn</sup> priority, was Then permitted To blather for many more than 5 minutes in a pro-nuclear vein. Why was he allowed to go ahead like that?

I have a few Things I feel you should consider. I have been attending our township supervisors' meetings To see how they are dealing with evacuation plans and was an observer at the Evacuation drill back in The 8<sup>th</sup> month. E. Vincent townships is one of The closest to Limerick generating station but it failed its evacuation drill and cannot arrive at an evacuation plan agreeable To all of the citizens.

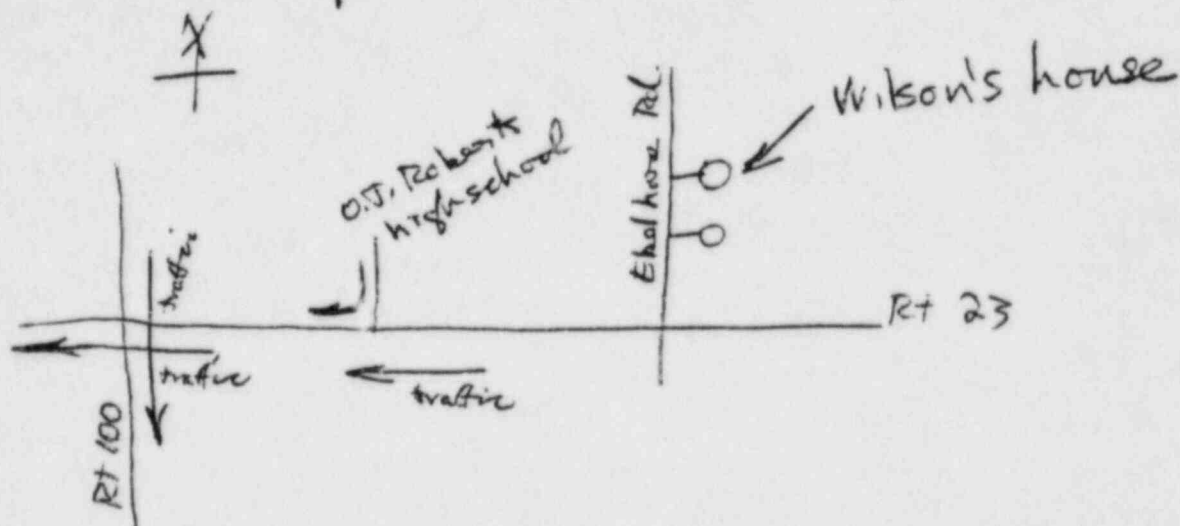
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Our town shop failed the drill according to FEMA & DEMA because we don't have enough people to keep the ~~DEF~~ E.O.C. open long enough. My chief concern ~~is~~ is that many (close to half) of the people running the EOC work at too great a distance from E. Vermont turnp. To be able to assure us that they could get to the turnp building in time to orchestrate an evacuation. Two of these volunteers, who are also supervisors of our (4700 population) municipality, refused to tell me at a public meeting where they work but one <sup>Everett Wilson</sup> works 20 minutes away & ~~the~~ other <sup>James Gravis</sup> half an hour away. I am <sup>afraid</sup> ~~sure~~ that in case of an event at Cimmerick these people would not be able to get to the EOC. The man in charge of transporting those in need of it, <sup>John Slunga</sup> works in center city, Phila. - on home drive under the best of circumstances. You must know where all these volunteers work before accepting a evacuation plan which relies on them! Also our emergency manager is purported to work for PECO which I find unacceptable - a conflict of interests.

Another serious problem we have with our evacuation plan and which our supervisors ignore is that there is no traffic control point at the corner of Ekelhove Rd. and

Rt. 23. This intersection is in E. Vincent  
 township but only 2 households in E.V. township  
 would benefit from a T.C.P. There.  
 We are one of those families



Although only a few people in E. Vincent  
 need this T.C.P., thousands in E, N & S.  
 Coventry townships would logically ~~travel~~  
 travel this route (especially E. Coventry  
 where MOST of the residents would  
 come this way).

We are presently planning to educate  
 our children at home as the school  
 plans are not sound (for evacuation).  
 One of the schools where our children would  
 be sent is less than one mile from  
 Limerick.
