



Detailed Description of Allegation: Individual has performed contract computer service function at Oyster Creek & GLUN Parsippany office for last 8 months. After about 6 mos on job, individual's employer requested that he apply for unescorted site access (i.e., to keep from having to be escorted as a Visitor every time he went to site). The individual's application and background check evoked several questions from GLUN access authorization personnel. The individual was terminate from the site on 9/17 as a result of the security investigation. The individual lost his job with the contractor as a result of the action.

Individual contends that he was mistreated during investigation process and that discriminatory actions were

taken by GPN personnel, namely:

- 1) national origin was questioned
- 2) nature of military discharge was questioned
- 3) related negative statements from 2 former employers that individual felt were "inappropriate"
- 4) was asked whether he had ever been convicted of DWI while a check of motor vehicle records would have shown that he hadn't
- 5) was inappropriately pressured regarding questions that GPN felt he had not answered fully on application; individual says he attempts to clarify these issues but was not given proper opportunity; questions were related to:

ON FBI report

- a) periods of unemployment (application was not specific enough)
- b) criminal charges (apparently, there was a criminal charge against this individual that was later dropped, and the individual did not feel he should have to put this on application)

Individual says he provided info to "Rich" from Ayster Creek to clarify these questions but that the info was not provided to Parsippany and that conclusions of investigation were made without acknowledging additional information he provided.

Individual says that all ~~his~~ he is looking for is to get issues cleared up and formally documented so that he can seek further employment without going through the same problems.

Some additional info related to the individual is noted on the following page:

- (1) Individual is a German citizen, but has lived in U.S. most of his life (since 1963). Took his stepfather's name (Romero) as a child and kept using it through military service. Approx. 2 yrs ago, individual changed his driver's license to his given name and has been using that since for identification.
- (2) Problem w/ Social Security. Individual was in a relationship from 1981-1989 with a woman who was collecting Soc. Sec. disability. Woman convinced him to sign up as an "ineligible spouse" (apparently, using his given name and a different SSN than the one he used under the name Romero). This allowed the woman to collect more money from social security. In the past 2-3 yrs, individual got in trouble by "mixing up" usage of his names and SSNs. Says he has "straightened this out" but GPN didn't acknowledge documentation.
- (3) Individual says he got an honorable discharge from the military. Says that GPN questioned him, based on his "background", and told him that he probably was given a general discharge. Individual says he has the DD-214 Form(?) to prove his point but that GPN would not acknowledge this.
- (4) Results of drug screening that was done for GPN's site access application were negative.
- (5) FYI - Individual also stated that he knew of a "murderer" who has been working @ DC for 10 years and has never been denied access!
