

I feel my request has been misunderstood. The
information I was requesting were the N.R.C.'s
point by point detailed review and recommendations
regarding the New York Power Authority's plans to
improve operations.

The document you sent me talks about these reviews
but has no specific assessments other than vague refer-
ences to the continuation of the review process.

I am willing to allow that the mistake was simply a
misunderstanding of what was being requested. I
would rather not believe that the N.R.C. is attempting
to stifle public participation by delaying and deliber-
ately confusing its responses to the public.

Please reassure me that the N.R.C. is indeed worthy
of its role of protecting the public by sending me the
following:

1. The " Diagnostic Evaluation Team Report "
as referred to in line 2 of the letter
you did provide me.
2. The Fitzpatrick Assessment Panel's Detailed
Review of the Fitzpatrick results improvement
Program - referred to in the second para-
graph of the letter you provided.

I hope to maintain the opinion that the N.R.C.
is capable of working with the public sector in
protecting our security. Thank you for your atten-


nation reach a consensus on this issue." I contend - congressman - that the people of this country are overdue for passage and implementation of the Russo bill - H.R. 1300 !

I work providing health care in a physician's office, and have for 8 years now. Prior to this I was a Health care technician in the hospital here in Norwich. I have - therefore - had the advantage of a long standing closeup view of how our health care system does and doesn't work. The MAJOR obstacle to providing good care to all who need it, (which I hope is our mutual objective) is the whole current reimbursement system. The multiple redundancy of public and private payments for health care and the crushing administrative costs associated with this are the primary reason for the increases in the costs of health care while so many of the disadvantaged people in our culture have inadequate or no coverage, and will likely remain poorly covered under any but a universal socialized system ie. the Russo bill.

Please do what you can to move this bill quickly and positively through congress. In the event that the Russo bill is stymied, Your endorsement of the N.Y.S. analog to it - N.Y. Health (A - 8912) would be greatly appreciated. (see appendix F)

In conclusion I again thank you for your help, and appreciate your voting record - especially your 'no' vote on H.R.776 with its pro-nuclear tilt. I hope I am helpful in providing opinions which, I feel, represent a large portion of your constituents.
