Please respond to confirm that, based on our telephone call today, you are withdrawing your request for regulatory relief from the requirements under license no. 08-03075-07 as outlined in your initial request dated April 10, 2020 . This was determined after reviewing your response dated 4/17/2020, and because your radiation safety staff and nuclear medicine staff are considered

essential personnel and are continuing operations as normal. You further noted that the radiation oncology program is not operational at this time. Additionally, you stated that your request was limited to the academic research operations covered under license no. 08-00386-19.
