Re: Reply to a Notice of Violation

On October 7, 1992 an on-site inspection was made at our Wynnewood, Okla. facility. The inspection determined that there was a radiation level in excess of 2 millirems in any one hour or 100 millirems in any seven consecutive days in one unrestricted area.

On November 12, 1992 we installed a cement enclosure within the restricted/secured storage area. After the gas cylinders were placed inside this enclosure, we took numerous measurements to determine the maximum radiation level. The maximum level detected was .3 millirems/hour.
