Thanks for your past information. But now I have another need for your help.

Enclosed is a report regarding the on-going, dangerous, blasting operation at the Limerick rock quarrying operation...on the same rock area on which the Limerick reactor is built.

It is obvious that the routine blasting with its vibrations traveling through the rock could loosen pipe supports or cause other effects that could cause ultimate accidents in the reactor as per report submitted.

Enclosed also is a letter from Dr. Denton of the NRC. From the date of our original report to his answer and now another delay, I feel this extremely important matter is being side-lined because NRC brushes us off as having no clout.

Please help us have this matter expedited. The NRC has a duty to citizens to protect in such matters.
