Gentleman:

The University of Cincinnati gives strong support to the American College of Nuclear Physicians and the Society for Nuclear Medicine and their petition regarding reevaluation on the NRC's assessment of fees for NRC licenses which authorize the human-use of radioactive material. Twice previously the University of Cincinnati has sent letters to the Nuclear Regulatory Commission protesting licensing, inspection and annual fees which pertain to the human-use of radioactive materials. In both letters the University of Cincinnati outlined concerns and adverse effect which may occur from the implementation (or substantial increase) of fees for licenses authorized to use radioactive material under 10 CFR 35 (human-use of radioactive material). The concerns and adverse effect coincide with those of the American College of Nuclear Physicians and the Society for Nuclear Medicine. The University of Cincinnati supports the petition for rulemaking filed by the American College of Nuclear Physicians and the Society for Nuclear Medicine (Docket No. PRM-170-3), and published in the federal register on October 13, 1992.
