Dear Mr. Carrico:

This is in reply to your letter dated 4 March regarding the qualifications of Dr. Robert Anacker as the Chairman of the Radiation Safety Committee and as the Radiation Safety Officer. A more detailed summary of Dr. Anacker's training and experience in working with radionuclides and in radiation safety is as follows:

Formal Training - Satisfactorily completed a four-week course in the study of Radioisotope Techniques given by the Oak Ridge Institute of Nuclear Studies.

Experience - Used C-14 for six weeks and I-125 for one year in biological experiments.

On-the-job Training - Served on the RML Radiation Safety Committee for three years under Dr. Bergman. In this capacity, Dr. Anacker assisted in writing a radiation safety manual; evaluated proposed research projects, involving use of radionuclides, for potential problems related to contamination, radiation exposure and generation of radioactive wastes; and assisted in teaching a course on radiation safety. He was a regular attendee at committee meetings and has been involved in many discussions and establishment of policy relating to use of equipment and facilities for radiation safety at RML.

We trust that this additional information will allow you to complete the review on our requested amendments to our licenses numbered 25-01203-01 and 25-01203-02. If we can be of further assistance, please feel free to get in touch with me.
