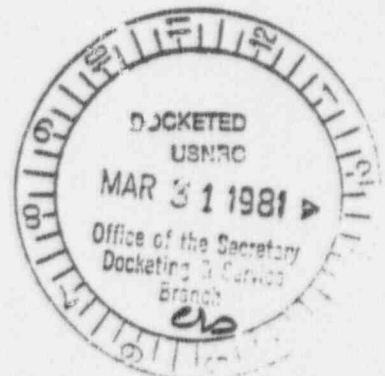
Regarding my request to intervene in the licensing procedure for the Wolf Creek Nuclear Plant near Burlington, Kansas, I hereby submit my contentions.

1. I contend that no nuclear plant should be licensed to operate until such time as there is a workable evacuation plan and until such time as the governing bodies in the evacuation areas are sufficiently staffed and equipped to successfully carry out evacuation plans.
2. I contend that Coffey County does not have a workable evacuation plan.
3. I contend that Coffey County does not have nor does it have funds to provide sufficient manpower or equipment with which to successfully respond to an incident at the plant which would involve radiation.
4. I contend that Coffey County does not have funds to cover cost of a response to an incident at the plant, and therefore, contend that there must be agreements made as to who pays the cost of evacuation, cost of response personnel and equipment, and costs of any damages caused by an incident at the plant. I contend that these agreements should be made prior to licensing of the plant for operation.
