The subject inspection did not disclose any health and safety problems.

During this inspection, two items of significance were discussed. The first item involved the interpretation of the qualification requirements for the position of Radiation Safety Officer. Following my explanation of the present license requirement, the licensee indicated he would like a little more flexibility in the requirements. The intent of the amendment request submitted on October 4, 1966, is to have completion of the course of the U. S. Army Chemical School, Fort McClellan, Alabama, together with two years' experience in an MOS-7330 position satisfy the requirements for completion of the radiation protection course required by paragraph 3 of Annex 6 which was submitted with the letter dated February 26, 1964. The second item discussed involved the feasibility of requesting permission to repackage radioactive waste. Such a request would be in connection with the licensee's need for an indoor facility to continue the handling of radioactive wastes during the winter months. It was suggested that the licensee describe the facilities and appropriate safety procedures and submit it to the Division of Materials Licensing to keep the file up-to-date.
