After the report has been reviewed by the Commission's regulatory staff, a Draft Detailed Statement on environmental considerations related to the licensed activity will be prepared. Upon completion of the Draft Detailed Statement, the Commission will, among other things, cause to be published in the FEDERAL REGISTER a summary notice of the availability of the Applicant's Environmental Report and the Draft Detailed Statement. The summary notice will request, within thirty (30) days or such longer period as the Commission may determine to be practicable, comments from interested persons on the proposed action and on the Draft Detailed Statement. The summary notice will also contain a statement to the effect that the comments of the Federal agencies and State and local officials thereon will be made available when received.

AEC MAKES AVAILABLE ENVIRONMENTAL REPORTS ON
TWO LICENSED FACILITIES IN OKLAHOMA

The Atomic Energy Commission is making available to the public environmental reports submitted by Kerr-McGee Corporation concerning the environmental aspects of two facilities located in Oklahoma.

The reports were submitted in response to the Commission's recently revised regulations on implementation of the National Environmental Policy Act under which the AEC is responsible for evaluating the total environmental impact of nuclear power plants and certain other licensed facilities.

The reports relate to Kerr-McGee's Uranium Hexafluoride Production Plant located in Sequoyah County, which was licensed by the AEC on February 20, 1970, and to the Company's Plutonium Fuel Plant located in Logan County, which was licensed on April 2, 1970.

After the reports are analyzed by the AEC Regulatory Staff, a draft detailed statement of environmental considerations will be prepared and made public. The Commission will seek comments from Federal and State agencies and interested members of the public before preparing a final detailed statement of environmental considerations for each facility.

Copies of the reports are available for public inspection at the Commission's Public Document Room, 1717 H Street, N.W., Washington, D.C., and in local public document rooms especially established in the vicinity of each project. For the Uranium Hexafluoride Production Plant the document room has been established at the Sallisaw City Library.
