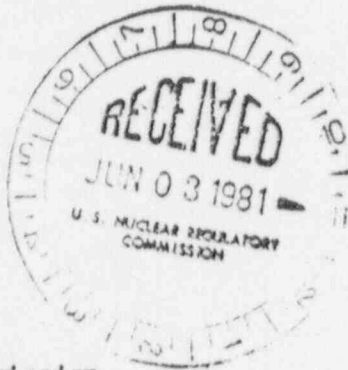

We wish to file an objection to the request by Commonwealth Edison Co. to increase their storage capacity at the Quad-Cities Nuclear Power Station, however they want to do it. It is extremely dangerous to almost triple the amount of nuclear waste stored in the limited space they have by "re-racking" the spent rods. This power station at Cordova has a very poor safety and security record. It is within ten miles of the Quad-Cities, the largest metropolitan area in Iowa and the second largest in Illinois.

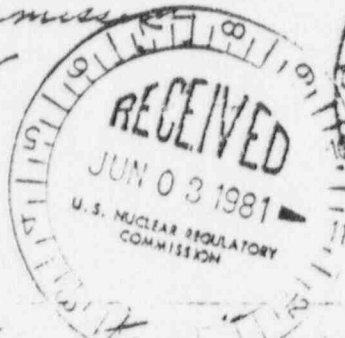
