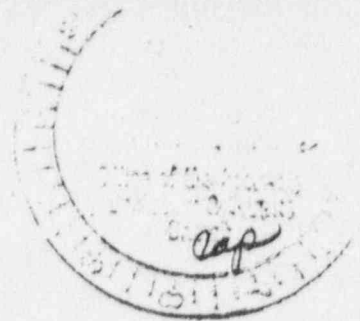

Dear Chairman Hendrie and NRC Commissioners,

We respectfully request that III Mile Island Unit I not be restarted for the following reasons:

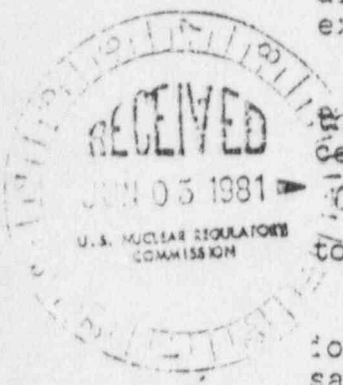
The III Mile Island employees and the public's health safety, and welfare can not be assured until Unit II is successfully decontaminated. The technical problems of cleaning up 700,000 gallons of radioactive water and successfully removing 39,000 fuel rods, many of them damaged, are of large magnitude, will require careful planning and execution, and will be of long duration.

There is leeching of cesium 137 into ground water at the site and this problem must be resolved before any consideration is given to future generation of electricity.

Metropolitan Edison has not demonstrated the capability to properly manage and operate the reactor.

Since Unit I & II are identical reactors, no consideration should be given to reopening Unit I until all necessary safety improvements have been identified and are fully installed.

The psychological impact of restarting Unit I to the surrounding, traumatized population must be fully considered.

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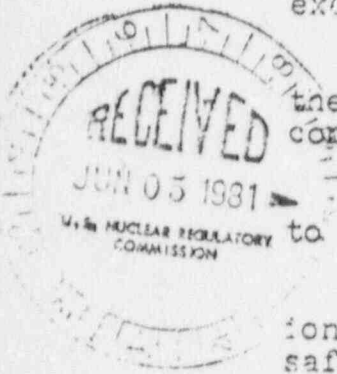

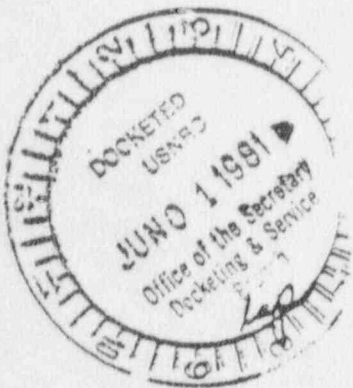
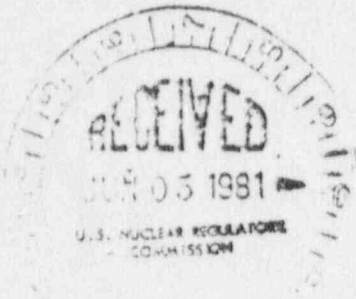
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Dear Mr. Hendrie,

out your other plans. Catherine M. Fargo



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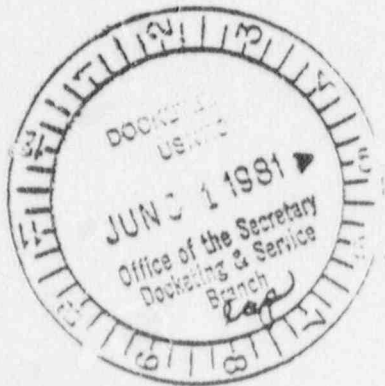
