I have retired at age 65 in 1975. I have invested almost all my lifesavings in GPU common stock and was receiving good return and was making a normal living with my wife.

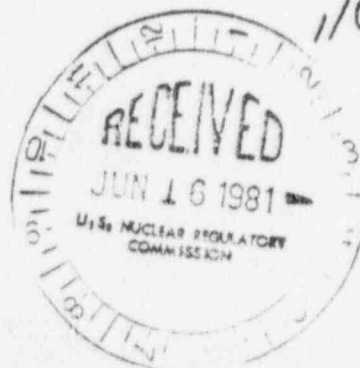
Since the day GPU has terminated dividends, we have got into financial trouble and my Social Security pension isn't enough to live on in this turbulent time of soaring costs of everything.
