Subject: Inspection Report No. 030-10041/85-01

This refers to your letter dated April 19, 1985, in response to our letter dated March 26, 1985, and to the telephone conversation on May 13, 1985, between Edwin A. Wurtz, Ph.D., of my staff, and Stephen R. DeLong, Director of Nuclear Medicine.

From this telephone conversation, we understand that management will provide for quarterly audits of the radiation safety program by an outside consultant. These audits will include a review of all procedures and training to insure compliance with the regulations and license conditions.

With regard to your assertion that your package opening procedures were consistent with your application and supporting documentation of May 20, 1980, we agree and withdraw this violation. However, we believe your proposed actions regarding this item is consistent with keeping exposures ALARA.

Thank you for informing us of the corrective and preventive actions documented in your letter and agreed to in the May 13, 1985 telephone conversation. These actions will be examined during a future inspection of your licensed program.

Your cooperation with us is appreciated.
